

DYNA PUBLISHING PROMOTES OPEN ACCESS

Given the growing demand for open access from the scientific community, at DYNA we are working to offer our authors, subscribers and readers the best conditions to access our database of articles and journals. We try to achieve the maximum visibility of the articles published, so that it benefits everyone, both in the dissemination of knowledge, as in the number of citations and improvement of the quality of the journal by offering our authors and collaborators, a quality journal, close and accessible.

As is well known, the idea of open access was first raised at the Budapest Open Access Initiative at a meeting held in Budapest by the Open Society Institute in December 2001. This proposal promotes the elimination of economic, legal and technological barriers, in order to obtain, in return, greater accessibility for documents and greater visibility for authors.

Documents that are freely available through open access are more consulted and more likely to be cited. In addition, another desired effect is that knowledge and scientific and technical advances are distributed as widely as possible, thus returning to society the fruits of its subsidised research.

Open access facilitates the availability of research results and promotes an increase in research productivity. Internet search engines and the publication of articles in open access repositories greatly increase the accessibility of journals.

There are many proposed initiatives and statements on open access for scientific material, which with small differences, support the need for the unrestricted availability of scientific information on the Internet for all mankind. In general, the coincidences between the various documents are based on the use of the Internet as a dissemination system and the availability without cost.

By "open access" we mean the free availability of articles on the Internet, allowing any user to read, download, copy, distribute, print, search or link to the full texts of these articles, browse them for indexing, pass them on as data for software, or use them for any other legal purpose, without financial, legal or technical barriers other than those that are fundamental to the Internet connection itself. The only limitation on reproduction and distribution, and the only function of copyright in this domain must be to give authors control over the integrity of their work and the right to be properly acknowledged and cited.

Open access publications show a growing trend. As barriers are reduced, more readers can access them and their impact is greater. To give some figures, in 2019 an estimated 0.6 million articles were published worldwide in open access. It is estimated that the open access system represented 20% of the articles published that year. Some estimates indicate that, by 2025, the percentage of journals in open access will reach 60% of the total.

DYNA wants to collaborate with this movement and offers the following options so that researchers who publish in our journal, both in the paper and digital versions, can use "open access".

Once the usual publication co-payment has been paid, the author can choose the open access option in two ways:

- **For 400€:** for this fee, any article can be open access, an aspect that not all journals contemplate.
- **For free:** Once the article is approved, author can deliver it translated into Spanish and English to the publisher. In this way, the English version will be published in open access without any associated cost.
